

**“\*16\* – Donna Collins & The Gritty Girls from Gravois”**

“16”, as referenced to “24”, except instead of Jack Bauer, CTU government agent saving the country from terrorists and high ranking foreign dignitaries, we see all-around good gal Donna Collins and her crew of female sharpshooters rescuing their season, restoring respectability and sending a message that just because their DNA might be different doesn’t mean they can’t kick some mighty Big Butt now and then.

This six-team division had the usual cast of characters, in-laws, outlaws plus various types of misdemeanor suspects. There would be three teams out of 21 Rock, two from Night Sky plus Donna’s team out of JP’s Corner Gravois. Although there are two members on the team of the male persuasion, this JP’s unit is often pejoratively and sacrilegiously referred to as ‘that girl team’.

Connotation being: ‘Well, they’re just girls. No big sweat. It’s not like they’ll give us much trouble. We’ll just show up for a couple hours, throw our sticks on the table, blow them away 11-2, 11-3 tops, send them back to the kitchen while we head on back to the ranch to celebrate another easy win.’ (Surprise guys.)

This season would be no different than any other season. The main starting lineup would alternate between the six female members unless one or two had to take a night off. Then the guys would fill in.

Looking back on the surprising events that took place this session will seem unfathomable to some and downright implausible to others. As Joe Friday so often said: “The facts, ma’am; just the facts!”

The facts: All principal events take place between 7:15 p.m. and 1:30 a.m.

Our story begins September 16, 2009. It was a Wednesday. The temperature was a nice easy 56 degrees with a cool breeze sweeping across the city and disappeared across the Jefferson National Memorial Bridge into Illinois. Along with the breeze went a flow of homeward bound commuters tailgating with speed higher than normal as if they knew the last one across was to be audited by the IRS.

I was working the day-watch out of Florissant. The call came in at 9:00 a.m. My partner is Charlie C, the boss is Rusty B; and my name’s Jay. I’m a pool player. Dum-da-dum-dum ....duummmmmmm!

The caller wouldn’t give his name but evidence in his voice told me something was up. He said to be aware; that this evening a ‘hit’ was in the works and the targets would be ambushed at 21 Rock Café and Sports Bar. 21 Rock is a rough but cool pseudo-biker establishment located out on Old Highway 21 in Jefferson County. I couldn’t get any more info outta him except to be alert, whatever that meant.

It didn’t take long to figure it out. I checked my calendar. There it was plainly marked on my 2009 issue of Playboy magazine where Miss September Kimberly Phillips was telling us about how she needed a break. I hardly noticed how the 22-year-old, 5’ 8” 125-pound smokin’ hot blonde bombshell from Fountain Valley (Corona), California had been working her perky butt off ever since she could remember, earning A’s in high school, paying for a car through a slew of waitressing jobs and scoring a liberal arts degree as she slaved away full-time at a Montessori school. I barely scanned over her ambitions that were to finish her education, see the world, learn to fly and be successful and happy in life. Her ‘turn-ons’ about confidence and individuality, seeing the sweet side of a guy, to make her laugh and smile. Her ‘turnoffs’ about liars and egotists, and her stay positive philosophy of life. There were various and sundry other things that made me think that if I ever decided to have a house build I’d want her in the blueprints.

But I digress. The big red letters told me all I needed to know. It hit me harder than an Ali right cross against Sonny Liston’s contorted face. The new Missouri 8 Ball Pool League season opened Monday night. And this being Wednesday meant only one thing... my God... that Girl Gang from Gravois called in the hit squad and was about to strike; and 21 Rock was to be their first victim. I wondered if the gang from Jefferson County knew just how bad an assault this would be.

### **The 72nd Missouri 8 Ball Pool League Season begins:**

“ONE” 09-16-09 (The following takes place at 21 Rock Sports Bar between 6:45 p.m. and 11:30 p.m.) JP’s gang drove onto 21 Rock’s parking lot about 6:45 p.m. They were there to open up the new season against 21 Rock’s #2 team. The motley crew gathered at the bar sneered when they saw six females walk thru the door with cue cases under their arms. As the women prepared for the night’s shootout, monotonic scowls were heard coming from various parts of the room. Approximately four hours and 45-minutes later business was taken care of. These gals shot their perky butts off by winning seven of the last nine games as Donna’s gang handed over a very convincing 11-6 shellacking on their hapless opponents. These mean mommas roughed up the competition so badly they dragged themselves to the men’s room to wash off the blood. Good thing Donna is a nurse. The season is officially underway. (1-0)

“TWO” 09-23-09 (The following takes place at JP’s Corner Sports Bar between 7:00 p.m. and Midnight) If the 3rd team from 21 Rock was out for revenge for what JP’s girls did to their #2 team last week, apparently someone forgot to pass along the memo. The ladies even offered up 2-games on the wire to give them a head start. These cool chicks breezed to a 7-0 lead before 21 Rock #3 got on the board. Then two games later they won only their second game of the night. Being outshot is one thing, but these guys were clearly out classed. After the smoke had cleared and the final tally was in, it turned out to be a worse beating than the felines gave 21 Rock #2. Donna Collins and Debbie Reese led the massacre with 3-wins each with Julie Hemann and Sharon Luitjens kicking in two each. 21 Rock #3 came away with more bruises than 21 Rock #2 ever did, 11-2 (11-4). (2- 0)

“THREE” 09-30-09 (The following takes place at Night Sky’s Bar between the 7:00 p.m. and 12:30 a.m.) The ladies took the match as far as it could go to, 21 games. Julie Hemann and Sharon Luitjens banged out 3-wins each and at one point JP’s led, 10-8. But Night Sky #1 brought in a high caliber fire power, extinguished the attack and held tough by pulling out the last three games handing the girls their first setback with a very tight 11-10 decision. (2-1)

“FOUR” 10-07-09 (The following takes place at JP’s Corner’s Gravois between 7:00 p.m. and Midnight) It was another tough match to lose as 21 Rock #1 brought their muscle for this very important meeting. Even after getting 2-games by way of forfeits and Kris Schlaefli knocking in three ‘W’s, JP’s went down with another 11-10 loss. The big gun for 21 Rock #1 was Chris “Deuce” Bieglow. He managed a double deuce. His 4-1 night coupled with teammates Rick Andrade and Ricky Leffert added 3-wins each was too much to handle. (2-2)

“FIVE” 10-14-09 (The following takes place at Night Sky Sports Bar between 7:00 p.m. and 11:32 p.m.) To close out round one JP’s received 3-games on the wire. Knowing what they were in for, Night Sky #2 brought in heavy artillery. Taking four wins the first frame, three the second and another four the third, Night Sky #2 took a convincing 12-8 decision. Russ Sechrest led their attack with four wins. On the positive side JP’s Pam Brink won two games from two very good ‘5’s, Bob Chuddy and Clint Lakamp. The other bright side about round one is even though JP’s now showed a 2-3 record, their games won-lost percentage was third best at .522. This would play a major part down the road. (2-3)

“SIX” 10-21-09 (The following takes place at JP’s Corner Gravois between 7:05 p.m. and 11:30 p.m.) After losing three straight matches that dropped JP’s Girls to 4th place, it was obvious somebody was in for a jack-hammer hammering. It was just bad luck it would be 21 Rock #2... again. Whatever frustrations these gals had built up inside of them over the last three weeks, it was all about to be unleashed tonight. A plan was hatched. It was a simple plan. Make quick work of them. Just go in firing and blow their nuts off.

It was like a personal vendetta. Giving 21 Rock #2 three-games head start is about the only positive thing that happened for them. Once the pills were rolled it was ‘oh, my god, here they come again.’ Julie pulled Chuck Perschpacher twice and ran over him twice. Donna drew Jeff Preston twice and beat him both

times. Debbie smoked Dave Evans their two meetings. Then Sharon and Kris took turns beating up on Tom Wright. It was like a bad tsunami. Wave after wave came after the Rockers.

The ladies took the last two games from round one, and all five the 2nd round for a 7-games streak. Then ending with four of the five in the 3rd round put 21 Rock #2 out of their misery. It was a 12-3 (12-6) beatdown. These guys went home more bruised than last time. Donna, Julie and Debbie posted 3-wins each and I'm thinking... 'uuummmm, is this what happens when PMS kicks in?' Damn.

Even before the last '8' ball was dropped one Rocker was last seen crawling toward the back door. "Let me outta here, help," he moaned. After tying up a few loose ends JP's ladies evened their record to begin the second round of matches. (3-3)

"SEVEN" 10-28-09 (The following takes place at 21 Rock Sports Bar between 6:53 p.m. and 12:23 a.m.) As before, if 21 Rock #3 entertained thoughts of revenge, they lasted about as long as Kayne West's popularity. By taking 4-wins the 2nd round 21 Rock actually led 6-4. Not to be out done, the ladies returned the favor with four wins the 3rd round taking over the lead, 8-7. And they didn't stop there. The pressure might have been a bit much for the Rockers as JP's added another three wins the 4th round taking away an 11-8 victory. With Sharon kicking in three wins and Jerry Brink adding another two, JP's knocked in seven wins of the last nine games played. But the highlight of the evening was Julie posting four 'W's against four different opponents. (4-3)

"EIGHT" 11-04-09 (The following takes place at JP's Corner Gravois between 6:43 p.m. and Midnight) Having to give 3-games on the wire to Night Sky #1 proved a tad much; especially when Murphy's Law enters the proceedings. Night Sky took 3-wins the 1st round and added three more the 2nd for a 9-4 lead. Several of those games could have gone the other way but when 'anything that can go wrong, will,' goes to prove that Murphy's Law still holds true. Night Sky added the first game from the 4th round to up their lead to 10-4. With a little encouragement Donna summoned up her posse and mounted a charge. Behind Julie and Debbie's 3-wins each, plus a late five-game surge, the match was now 10-9. (With Debbie's three wins it gave her a 10-game winning streak.) However, Cliff Fuchs put out JP's fire when he won his 4th game of the match for an 11-9 Night Sky #1 victory. (4-4)

"NINE" 11-11-09 (The following takes place at 21 Rock Sports Bar between 7:02 p.m. and 12:05 a.m.) It wasn't a very auspicious beginning for JP's ladies. 21 Rock #1 opened by winning four of the first five games played. JP's brought back three the 2nd frame and added another three wins the 3rd bringing the contest closer, 8-7. It just wasn't to be. Even though Donna, Kris and Pam posted 2-win nights, it wasn't enough to hold off Rockers. They came back strong in round four with three of the four games played for the 11-8 victory when both Rick Andrade and Butch Siegler added their 3rd wins of the match.

Night Sky #2 pulled further away from the crowd with an 11-9 win over 21 Rock #3 to run their division lead to 8-1, or 4-games over JP's. (4-5)

"TEN" 11-18-09 (The following takes place at JP's Corner Gravois between 6:53 p.m. and 12:24 a.m.) This match against Night Sky #2 was so important for JP to win that had they not won they could very well have not gotten to the .500 mark, or to make a serious run for the title. This outcome would either be JP at 4-6 to Night Sky #2's 9-1, or JP 5-5 to Night Sky #2's 8-2. A very important two-game swing was at stake that both teams were award of. To begin this important match JP received 2-games on the string. Night Sky took charge from the opening bell. Their 4-win round took over the lead, 4-3 and looked mighty good, but when they posted another 3-wins the 2nd round it looked even better at 7-5. It seemed that the situation was getting bleak for the Girls from Gravois.

And just when it seems hope is gone a couple breaks come your way. Debbie, Julie and Kris put up wins the 3rd round closing the gap, 9-8. The 4th frame begins and Debbie and Julie even the score at 10-10. That brought Kris to the table again. To say that Kris Schlaefli was just free-wheeling willy-nilly is like saying that Mount Rushmore is just another mountain. Ms Schlaefli was a picture of earnest

concentration. She went up against four different opponents and defeated each one. Her 4th win was against Rick Storz, who had already won three games. Night Sky's Bob Chudy had already put four wins on the board; the 4th putting Night Sky #2 on the bubble. But when the gals fought back to tie, Kris took the 'hill' game for a great come-from-behind and very needed win. This brought the team back to .500. And Night Sky #2 fell to 8-2, but still 3-games in front. (5-5)

"ELEVEN" 11-25-09 (The following takes place at 21 Rock Sports Bar between 6:55 p.m. & 11:02 p.m.) To begin the 3rd round of matches Donna brought in reinforcements; and Jim Hopen paid dividends immediately. Giving 3-games head start to 21 Rock #2 really didn't present a problem for this serious JP lineup. With Kris and Debbie pitching in with two wins each, and Jim's three wins, Donna stole the show by taking all four games she played, and three were against Tom Wright. It was rumored that Tom offered up his resignation after dropping the third game. And that's too bad, because Tom's a nice guy. At this point Tom was 3-6 against the ladies and as the Godfather always says, 'nothing personal, Tom, just business'. Donna was just doing her job keeping JP's in the running. The 12-5 (12-8) beating over 21 Rock #2 made it three wins in row over this team and put JP's over the .500 mark for the first time since the season began. Tonight's win moved JP's Girls 2-games closer as Night Sky #2 dropped an 11-10 squeaker to 21 Rock #1. Donna moved into the top five positions on the All-Star sheet with a new 20-12 record. Night Sky #2 now 8-3. (6-5)

"TWELVE" 12-02-09 (The following takes place at JP Corner Gravois between 6:55 p.m. and Midnight) 21 Rock #3 came to town with felony on their minds. And it seemed they would indeed steal this match. They opened by taking three games the first round and added another three the second. The 6-4 lead put 21 Rock #3 in the driver's seat. But the ladies changed gears and ran off eight of the last 11 games for an 11-9 come-from-behind very necessary win. Even though Mike Waters reeled off 4-wins for his Rockers, he was out-dueled. Mike was matched and raised as both Donna and Kris posted 4-wins of their own. Nothing like being two-timed, huh, Mike!

This was the first time two JP shooters fired 4-0 records in the same match. It was also the second time both Donna and Kris had 4-0 nights. As the losing team was walking out the door someone was overheard to say 'before we play them again maybe they'll pull a Thelma and Louise'. (Now that's respect.) As this match was taking place, JP's got a boost in the standings as Night Sky #1 put a job on sister team Night Sky #2, 11-6. JP's moved into second place in the standings at 7-5, now only one-game behind Night Sky #2's 8-4. With Donna having a second consecutive 4-win match that ran her winning streak to 8, she moved into the number four spot on the All-Star sheet with a neat 24-12 .667. Kris also moved into the top 10 with a nice 24-18 .571. (7-5)

"THIRTEEN" 12-09-09 (The following takes place at Night Sky's Bar between 7:13 p.m. and 11:22 p.m.) Momentum continued for these Gritty Gravois Girls both ways. (1) Though they had to give Night Sky #1 three-games on the wire it didn't slow down their determination. These females were acting more like Roller Derby hooligans than fine upstanding cultured ladies. The tip-off came when they kicked their opponents right in the groin then laughed after taking all five games the first round. Feeling sorry (but not much) for their hurting opponents cringing in pain, the girls let up a little the second round. We feel it was kind of them to take *only* three wins. This made the score 8-2 (8-5). With two wins in the third round and two more in the fourth, that ended the beatdown. (And a sigh of relief from the guys knowing it was finally over.) The 12-5 (12-8) slaughter moved these gals into first place by percentage points over Night Sky #2 who just took a 12-9 defeat from 21 Rock #2. (8-5 to 8-5)

(2) Donna continued her assault for Top Player by having yet another 4-win night. This ran her winning streak to 12. At this point only one player stood in her way. But there were still three weeks remaining to this session and Donna was surrounded by four Night Sky #2 players. There was Russ Sechrest to the right of her and Bob Chudy to the left. Clint Lakamp in the middle and Rick Storz on top; well... not literally on top, but you know what I mean. Rick, 32-10 .762 – Donna, 28-12 .700.

“FOURTEEN” 12-16-09 (The following takes place at JP’s Sports Bar between 6:45 p.m. and Midnight) For the first time this season these wonderfully wantoned women waylaid 21 Rock #1. This beating was 11-8 and just enough to keep JP’s in first place over Night Sky #2 who also won their match, 11-7. Donna and Sharon won three games each while Kris and Debbie added two each. Donna’s first win took her personal winning streak to 13.

For Night Sky #2 Bob Chudy and Rick Storz went 3-0, Russ Sechrest 2-0, and Clint Lakamp 2-1. With two weeks to go Rick led Donna 35-10 .778 to 31-13 .705. (9-5 to 9-5)

“FIFTEEN” 12-23-09 (The following takes place at Night Sky’s Bar between 7:15 p.m. & 11:03 p.m.) This third and last match of the session against Night Sky #2 could very well be JP’s Waterloo. Each team had a victory over the other. Whatever had taken place to this point meant nothing. This was it. The winning team tonight would take over first place all alone with only one week remaining.

Remember it was Lord Wellington who met and defeated Napoleon at Waterloo, and the gang from Night Sky would try to do the same over JP’s. After all, these gals were invaders. Who are they to come onto someone else’s turf without written permission? They couldn’t get away with that. And they didn’t.

The gang from Night Sky came out smokin’. After the big cannons finished their assault it was Bob Chudy who led the charge with a 4-win night. Russ Sechrest went 3-0. Clint Lakamp won two with Rick Storz and Mike Stewart one each. Yep, it was brutal. The 11-7 Night Sky victory told the story. Now once again they were in charge, 10-5 to JP’s 9-6.

The race for top player continued. Rick Storz, going 1-2 tonight, still had the lead with his 36-12 .750. Donna put up a 2-1 night raising her to 33-14 .702.

“SIXTEEN” 12-30-09 (The following takes place at JP’s Sports Bar between 7:00 p.m. & Midnight) Going into this final week two things were up for grabs, (1) Night Sky #2 was in the cat-bird seat for the team championship, 10-5 to JP’s 9-6. And (2) four teammates from Night Sky #2 had a chance at Top Player along with JP Corner’s Captain Donna Collins. If Rick Storz wins one game it’s all over. He did not. By his own admission he played three games, got to the ‘8’ first, and blew each chance. That left Russ Sechrest needing four wins. He got only one of the three he played. Clint Lakamp needed four wins and got none. Last was Bob Chudy. Bob really had the best chance for four wins; that is until the pills were rolled out for the fourth round. At this point Bob had won the three games he played.

Bob drew the number-5 pill which meant that since 21 Rock #1 was on the hill 10-5 all four players in front of Bob would have to win their games to give him an outside chance. Bob’s chances faded faster than Tiger Woods’ chances of getting all those 10-million-dollar endorsements back when the first player Mike Stewart lost to Mike Mann. This brought Bob’s final totals to 35-14 .714.

This leaves Donna. Talk about a coup de thé-âtre! If she losses one game her chance for the trophy is gone. However, should she win three games there would be at least a tie. Four would put her over the top. And of the five players that needed four wins not many would have bet on the female to pull it off. L.A. bookies took a beating on this one. (That’s Lower Arnold for those of you on the east side.)

Suddenly Mike Mann is on Donna’s Christmas card list. Not only did Donna top the field for her first Top Player award, but this victory tied Night Sky #2 for first place sending the tie-breaker to the games won-lost percentage column. Here we find that JP’s Corner edged out Night Sky #2, 163-142 .534 to 152-145 .512, or a scant .022 difference.

For the coup de grâce Donna Collins edged out Bob Chudy and Rick Storz for Top Player honors. Donna ended this tough campaign 37-14 .725. Bob was runner-up, 35-14 .714 and Rick third, 36-15 .706. What a wild ride. Two great races that wound down to the very last games played.

### **To Recap:**

With the final tallies in it was a sweep by JP’s Corner. Not only did they snatch victory from the jaws of Night Sky #2 on the 16th and final week, but Donna (let’s have some funna) Collins ripped off Top Player status with her very last game played. Which begs the question: When did Donna Collins turn into

Allison Fisher? When did Julie Hemann trade places with Loree Jon (Ogonowski) Jones? And is that really Kris Schlaefli or Ewa Laurance? No way is Sharon, Pam and Debbie really Sharon, Pam and Debbie. And wasn't it nice of Butch and Sundance (Jim and Jerry) once the situation was under control to hang back in the shadows allowing the ladies the pleasure of basking in Klieg lights all to themselves.

As they always say in the Virginia Slims commercials, 'you've come a long way, baby.' And then you would see some hot chick right out of Coco Chanel fire up one of those 101 millimeters. Those profound words could be meant for several of the ladies that qualified for the singles event, but none more deserving than Donna Collins. Season after season, year after year Donna has been captaining teams from the Missouri 8 Ball Pool League and more often than not just missing the cut off to the big events. This season they would not be denied. Donna and the gang shot hard in getting their team to Division #4's team Championship.

JP's 10-6 finish looked somewhat unattainable after the 9th week's results were in. They were 4-5 while Night Sky #2 was riding high at 8-1. The girl's chances of overcoming those odds were about as good as Scott Brown coming outta nowhere to beat Martha Coakley for Ted Kennedy's vacant Senate seat.

But like Scott Brown pulling off that upset, the ladies did also. By putting together a 5-game winning streak and taking six of their last seven matches, and Night Sky #2 going 2-5, these Gritty Gravois Girls did what most critics thought impossible. A team made up basically of six women, with only two guys, brought home their first 1st place trophy. Big ups, gang.

**I.Q. Jones** offers up this scenario: "**Donna Collins** and her posse have to be the best and hottest outlaw gang since Belle Starr or Cattle Annie and Little Britches. They ride into town, shoot it up, rob another opponent then hightail it outta there leaving a trail of walking wounded. And those not involved sit around in a daze wondering what the hell just happened."

**Jay Carlton** making a couple points: "One, prior to opening night Vegas odds makers voted that any team comprised of 75-percent women, their chances of taking out first place would be close to the National debt. A dinner theater star in Sheboygan had a better chance of accepting a best actor Oscar. And two, the odds that Donna Collins would be accepting Top Player honors would be twice the National debt. I mean, think about it, a community organizer in Chicago being elected president had a better chance."

**Joe Lombardo**zzi: "Congratulations to a very deserving Donna Collins for her Top Player Award and to all the fine ladies that make up this unique JP's Corner Gravois team. It's a pleasure to know they are not the Medellin Cartel of Division #4. That they did not use drugs to overthrow their enemies. No steroids, no cocaine – a little booze maybe, but absolutely nothing other than great shooting, femanine wilds and flirtatious ways. As a very intuned philosopher once said, 'if you got it, flaunt it'. And can these Bossom Beauties flaunt it! And to Jerry and Jim, be cool. You might make the starting lineup some day. Until then, every team needs a couple bench warmers."

**Jay** again: The race for Top Player is another five-page turner. For now I'll simplify it. The first 10 weeks **Donna Collins** was 16-12 .571. The first three players on the sheet were all above .700. It was the final six weeks where Donna upstaged them, out-shot them and plain overwhelmed the opposition by going on a rampaging 21-2 .913 attack.

Totally awesome display of shooting! In six weeks Donna went from 11th place co-star to Top Billing 'Star of the Show'. Her 37-14 .725 was .011 better than runner-up Night Sky #2's Bob Chudy, 35-14 .714, and .019 better than and Bob's teammate Rick Storz at 36-15 .706. There have been hundreds of great races in the 25-years of M0-8. This has been one of the very best. This was Donna's first 'Kick Butt' Top Player trophy and it couldn't have happened to a nicer lady. Congrats, kiddo.

In addition, Donna's Den of Artful Dodgers making the All-Star sheet were **Kris Schlaefli** (28-22 .560), **Julie Hemann** (26-25 .510) and **Sharon Luitjens** (also 26-25 .510). **Debbie Reese** was a few games short of making the honor roll but her 19-7 .731 played an integral part in the outcome of this campaign.

**Adjective Adams** gives his personal opinion: Magnificent. Impressive. Colossal. Enormous. Momentous. Tremendous. Stupendous. Humongous. Mind-blowing. Awe-inspiring. Extraordinary. Sensational. Dramatic. Intimidating bunch of bullies – and they are soooooo... HOT.”

**Anonymous** phoned in this request: “Now that the ladies from JP’s Corner Gravois won their first division team Championship, will JP’s owner insist on showcasing the girls by allowing them to put on a “Lingerie 8 Ball” tournament? Think about it. I’m sure we could get Victoria Secret to donate some of their latest evening attire. And I’d bet that several of JP’s customers would willingly pony up a few bucks for the show.”

(Now, I’d paid to see that. Heh, heh, heh!)
